This is the Third Quarterly Status Report of calendar year 2016 for the Los Angeles County Regional Park and Open Space District (the District). The allocation of funds to the different agencies shown in the two tables below reflects the updated transfer and assignment of funds, showing which agency has the right to apply for funds.

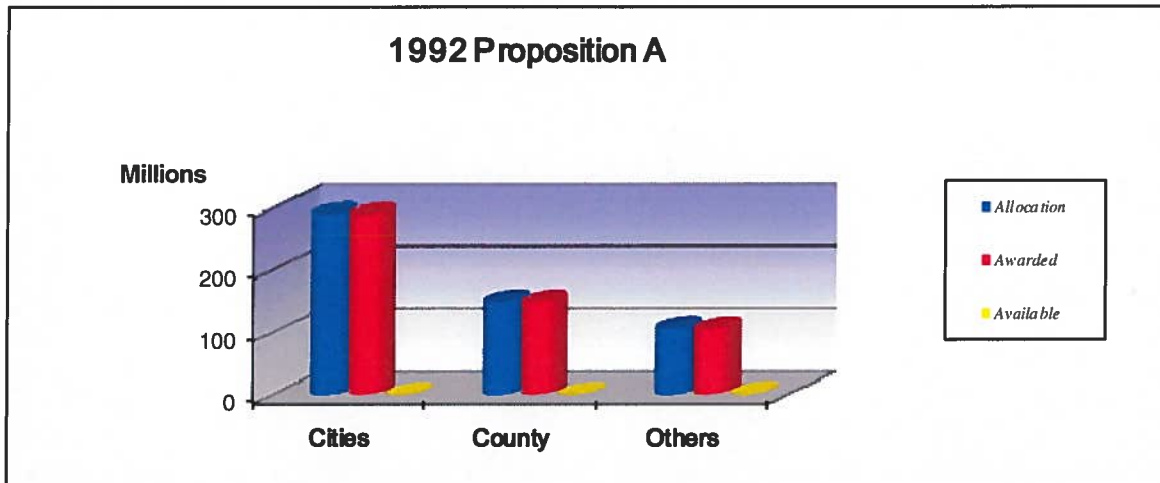

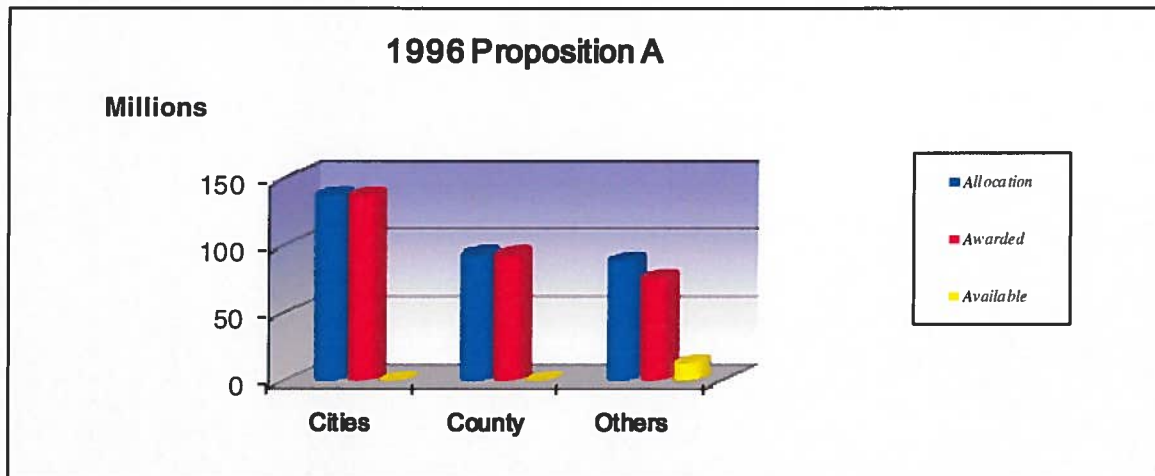
