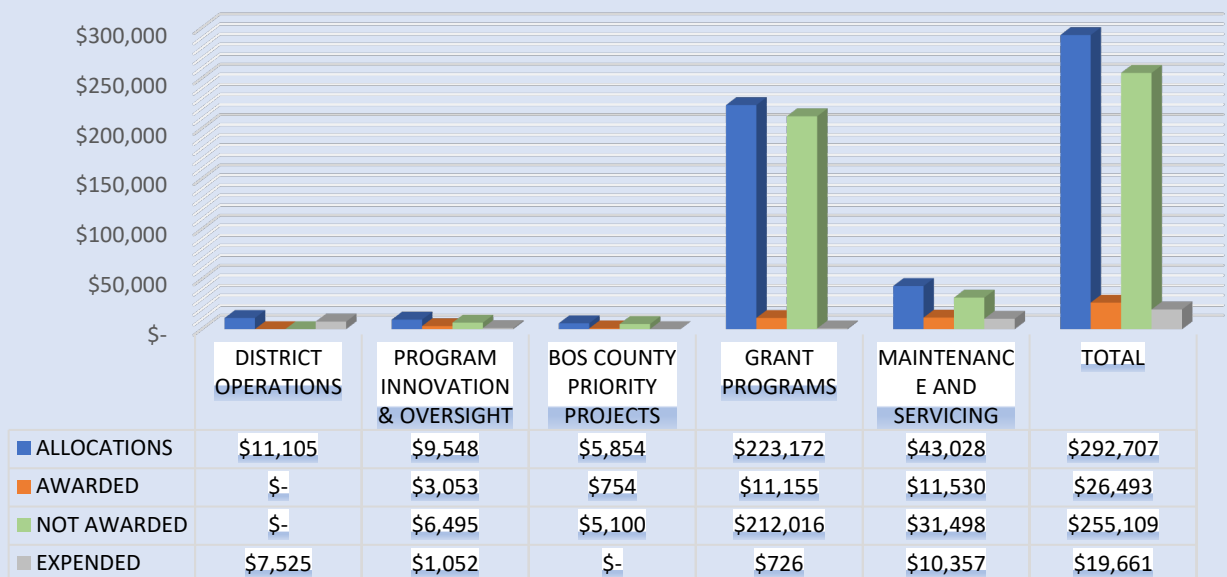
This first Quarterly Status Report of Fiscal Year 2020-21 provides detailed information on the administration of Measure A funds for the operations of the District and implementation of its programs.
